

Call for Papers: Day of Belgian Migration History

The fourth edition of the **Belgian Migration History Day** will take place on **22 September 2021** at the **Université Saint-Louis – Bruxelles**.

The aim of this day is to provide an opportunity for all those interested in the history of migration in Belgium to meet, whether they belong to the academic world, the educational administration, the cultural or the media sectors.

This day will be divided in **three sessions**. It will be opened by an academic session during which the latest research results on the Belgian history of migration (19th-20th centuries) will be presented.

A poster session will follow during the lunch break, during which novice or amateur historians will introduce their research project or their contribution to the history of Belgian migrations.

The afternoon session, in the form of a round table, will focus on the transmission of migration history through the media. It will be introduced by a **keynote** lecture by Professor **Gérard Noiriel** (EHESS –Paris), Doctor honoris causa 2021 of the Université Saint-Louis – Bruxelles.

Proposals for contributions to the academic and poster sessions should be sent to crhidi@usaintlouis.be with the wording "**Day of Belgian Migration History – Academic session**" or "**Day of Belgian Migration History – Poster Session**" by **Tuesday 15 June 2021**. They should take the form of an abstract of maximum 250 words accompanied by a biographical note of maximum 100 words, in English, Dutch or French. **Special attention will be given to proposals that combine migration history with an aspect of legal and institutional history.** The scientific committee will then make a selection as soon as possible.

The best contributions of the day may be included in a special issue of *C@hiers du CRHIDI* to be published in spring 2023.
